About:

The Ottawa Police Department's Citizen Police Academy will start in February of 2010 in order to educate and inform the citizens of Ottawa about their police department's operations. While the CPA is not a police officer "training class," it is an exciting opportunity for citizens to go behind the scenes of the Ottawa Police Department.

The CPA program is provided to citizens at **NO COST.**

Class Schedule:

This voluntary course is limited to the **first 20 approved participants.** Participants meet weekly on Wednesday evenings from 6:30PM to 8:30PM, with the exception of a few classes which will end at 9PM. A majority of the classes will be held at the Ottawa City Hall-Council Chambers.

Course Objectives

The Citizens Police Academy is designed to educate the public about the Ottawa Police Department and increase rapport between citizens and police officers.

The academy highlights the importance of citizen participation in public safety, so that we as a community remain free from the fear of crime.

Our hope is that the graduates of the Citizens Police Academy become more aware and better informed about how the Police Department operates, and will encourage friends, coworkers and families to join the Ottawa Police Department in this rewarding program.

Class Topics:

Experienced police officers, detectives, dispatchers, and other instructors will provide instruction about their various fields of work, with demonstrations and various hands on experiences offered to participants. Topics of discussion will center around providing the participant with a general overview of the Police Department's operations, information on the application process,

roles of Police Officers in the community. And much more...
